

IHS - Critical Infrastructure Research Forum

The SHSU Institute for Homeland Security announces the creation of the Critical Infrastructure Research Forum (CIRF) with the goal of establishing a funded pipeline to conduct research on critical infrastructure protection (CIP) topics. CIRF is a collaboration between IHS and industry partners to identify gaps in knowledge and to develop strategic solutions to mitigate risk across all CI sectors. Our goal is to provide innovative, value-added knowledge tailored to the needs of industry and public institutions, to protect critical infrastructure supporting Texas and the nation's economy.

CIRF is funded through corporate sponsorships and research grants. Our Steering Committee will provide insights and guidance as we identify and prioritize research projects completed by members of the IHS research team. The research team is comprised of doctoral, post-doctoral, and subject matter experts working with industry partners during the research process. This allows industry professionals to engage with individuals pursuing careers in CIP creating a pathway to employment for participants.

An additional goal for CIRF is to create professional development training opportunities and offer workshops to share research findings and best practices for CIP risk mitigation for industry partners. Training will align with industry needs and security management regulatory compliance. Partners will have access to these resources to improve overall performance and to achieve bottom line goals.
