Critical Infrastructure Research Forum (CIRF)

The SHSU Institute for Homeland Security has launched the Critical Infrastructure Research Forum (CIRF) to advance research in critical infrastructure protection (CIP). This initiative aims to fill knowledge gaps and develop strategic solutions to mitigate risks across all critical infrastructure sectors. The primary goal is to produce innovative, tailored knowledge that meets the specific needs of industry and public institutions, thereby safeguarding critical infrastructure vital to both Texas and the nation's economy. Funding for CIRF is sourced from corporate sponsorships and research grants. A dedicated Steering Committee will offer guidance and insights, assisting in the identification and prioritization of research projects undertaken by the Institute for Homeland Security (IHS) research team. This team consists of academic and professional subject matter experts collaborating closely with industry partners throughout the research process. Additionally, SHSU students will play a crucial role as research assistants within CIRF. Their involvement not only supports research efforts but also provides industry professionals with opportunities to mentor and engage with future professionals pursuing careers in critical infrastructure protection. This student engagement aims to create a direct pathway to employment within the field of CIP.







Enhancing Crisis Resilience in Healthcare Supply Chains

Dr. Willow, Yang & Dr. Pamela, Zelbst

Dr. Willow Yang is an Assistant Professor of Supply Chain Management at Sam Houston State University (SHSU). She is an active contributor to academic literature and serves as a reviewer for several prestigious journals. Dr. Pamela Zelbst is a Distinguished Professor of Supply Chain Management at Sam Houston State University (SHSU). Dr. Zelbst holds two patents and has over forty published articles in high-ranking journals.

This research aims to equip Texas healthcare organizations with the necessary tools and insights to enhance the resilience of their supply chains. This includes understanding vulnerabilities, developing resilience strategies, establishing a Supplier Risk Assessment Scorecard, and finding the right balance between efficiency and resilience. It provides a detailed



examination of the inherent vulnerabilities within healthcare supply chains, including over-reliance on global suppliers, supply chain complexity and lack of transparency, just-in-time inventory management practices, and logistical challenges posed by the worldwide scope of sourcing and distribution. Multiple strategies to enhance the resilience of healthcare supply chains are proposed, including identifying and prioritizing critical supplies, diversification of supply sources, collaboration among healthcare organizations, what-if scenario planning, and supply network mapping. These strategies aim to establish a supply chain that is both responsive and robust, capable of withstanding sudden demands and disruptions.
